FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hi everyone

Thank you to everyone who contributed to making our Food and Fun Fair such a wonderful success This includes our organising committee, stallholders, schools, entertainers, musicians, RFS, clean-up crew, Dr Gordon Reid for drawing our raffle and our community for attending. Over one thousand dollars each was raised from our raffle and Devonshire tea rooms. We are working through the overall financial position and figures will be available for our final Progress Association meeting for this year. Robert has prepared a more detailed update later in this newsletter.

How quickly the past twelve months have passed. As I read through last years report, we were working on two key initiatives - the cenotaph restoration and new shed installations both of which have been completed.

This year we received funding for several initiatives, the largest being for the recladding of the Progress Hall with work commencing in January 2025 with completion by end of February.

In September, your Progress Association hosted a "Meet the Candidate" forum allowing our community to meet and ask questions of many of the candidates standing for council. Your Progress Association believed the evening was a success in terms of attendance, high engagement and candidate commitment.

We have continued to follow up with council and other stakeholders in respect of several concerns raised by our community. These include foreshore erosion and restoration; waterfront play area upgrades and Greenfield Road speeding. Hopefully now that we have a new council, we will be able to progress these initiatives.

Information and consultation sessions are underway by the Hawkesbury Nepean River System — Coastal Management Program (CMP). These sessions are to allow those who live, work, or play along our valued river system to have input on how it is managed. Remaining sessions are taking place at the venues and dates below. At our February Progress Association meeting, it was proposed that the Progress Association host a waterfront event. It was explained at this meeting that this would require significant funding and resources to achieve. We applied for funding to host this event and in the last few days have been informed our funding request was not successful. I understand a detailed reason will be provided and hopefully this will be available for our next meeting. Over the past two years, Crown Land have released grant funding for crown land reserves which in theory would allow all the Empire Bay waterfront concerns including erosion, play area and boat ramp issues to be addressed. As reported previously, your Progress Association can not apply for this grant funding but Council as manager of the waterfront reserve are eligible. I have written to our new council members requesting that they assist in the facilitation of this grant funding by appointing a council contact person to work with your Progress Association.

As I comment in all my updates, it would be great to see many more of you at the Progress Association meetings. We are here to represent you at council, state, and federal level. It is critical that we hear from you to ensure our representation is fair, balanced and addresses the important issues to you. Without your ongoing support it is extremely difficult to continue organising and hosting our local events that our community gets great pleasure from. The last meeting for 2024 of the Progress Association will take place on December 4th. It would be great to see a strong

community presence.

Our final event for 2024, will be our annual Xmas Eve BBQ on 24 December. I look forward to seeing you all at this time. If anyone is available to assist, please let me know.

To our community, their families, and friends, please have a wonderful safe Christmas. I hope that 2025 brings everyone happiness and good health.

SUCCESS AT 2024 UCI MASTERS TRACK CYCLING WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

You may have noticed a senior cyclist training in the streets of Empire Bay. That was local resident, Hugh Gray, preparing for the 2024 UCI Masters Track Cycling World Championship in Roubaix, France.

"I built up great form cycling in and around the Bay and decided to see how I went against the world's best."

Hugh, one of the oldest competitors in the event, won four silver medals, in the scratch race, individual pursuit, points race and sprints; as well as a bronze in the 500m time trial.

Hugh races in the 80+ men.

Hugh set a new national record posting 13.74 in the flying 200m.

Hugh is a member of the Central Coast Cycling Club and is a keen competitor in cycling events. He particularly likes to ride the track. As well as cycling in the local area, Hugh also trains on the outdoor track at Adcock Park, West Gosford, and likes to ride on the boards at Dunc Gray velodrome in Bass Hill.

He was part of 22-strong contingent of Australian masters track cyclists at the world titles.

Hugh will return to Roubaix in October 2025.'I'm going for gold!' says Hugh.

OUR SCHOOL



Starting in Term 2, our passionate Year 6 Sustainability Leaders partnered with the Rumbalara Environment Education Center to tackle a persistent issue: plastic waste in the playground. Years of learning about sustainability inspired them to go beyond simply recycling. They wanted to actively reduce single-use plastics in our community.

Their solution? Educate peers, families, and the community on alternatives to plastic, focusing on replacing cling film with Beeswax Wraps. Through engaging activities, including a News Report Video, they spread awareness to students K-6. At community events like Election Day and the Empire Bay Food and Fun Fair, they connected with locals, sharing the ease and impact of small changes like switching to Beeswax Wraps.

PET CORNER

As we all start to finalise the school and work year with end of school celebrations and other activities, as well as the weather warming up your dog may need to be spending a little more time at home or on their own, so what better time for me to share some of my favourite enrichment games you can enjoy with your dog. Mental enrichment is important. Here are some ideas that will help transition your dog from chew toys to problem solving games.

Muffin tin and tennis balls interactive game

Place a tennis ball into each of the cups of a muffin tin, and then place a treat under some or all of the tennis balls in the tin. Your dog will need to use his problem solving skills to find the treats. Does he:

- a) Use his paws to dig them out?
- b) Use his nose to nose them out?
- c) Use his mouth and pick them up?

Which pot is it?

You'll need 3 small pot plant pots

Turn the pots upside down on the ground. Place a treat under one pot. Move the pots around. Invite your dog to find the treat. How long does it take him to sniff it out?

Undercover

Hide some treats under a towel, mat or blanket on the ground. You dog will have to work out how to let up the towel to get the treats. For an advanced version, roll some treats up in a towel and let your dog work out how to unravel the towel to get the treats.

Get your dog thinking about how to get the treats, and utilise problem solving skills. They are also a great way of encouraging your dog to amuse themselves.


