

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hi everyone,

Planning is well underway for our Anzac Day commemoration ceremony. This year, we have been fortunate enough to receive a small grant to pay for some of the larger expenses incurred with hosting our event. Each year, we are privileged to have several veterans and dignitaries attend our ceremony which is testament to the welcome and support provided by our Empire Bay community. It is also wonderful to see so many families and children in attendance. I look forward to seeing you all again in April.

Updates on items mentioned in my January newsletter:

Recladding of the Progress Hall is almost complete. We have taken the opportunity to refresh the hall with a new colour scheme. Please walk round or drive past and have a look. We have a small amount of painting left to complete prior to final walk through and sign off. Project progress reports have been provided to the Office of Responsible Gambling in line with our grant conditions. We have taken the opportunity to apply for a further grant to paint the internals of the Progress Hall, upgrade the electrical system and to undertake leveling of the hall floor. If successful, the hall should require no further significant investment for many years.

No further updates have been received from either Crown Lands or council in respect of the waterfront. I have taken the opportunity to write to both Adam Crouch and Jared Wright in respect of my discussion with Crown Lands. They have both agreed to take up internally with council and recognise the importance of this to our community. I will provide updates as they become available. I have also taken the opportunity to follow up with council in respect of the Empire Bay boat ramp which is in urgent need of repair. As per what has become the normal position, council's response is that there is no budget available with budget planning underway for next year where it may be considered. I have taken the opportunity to re-emphasis to council that this appears to be the case with any Empire Bay concern including the indefinite deferment of the Shelly Beach Road upgrade, Boongala Ave flooding, Greenfield Road signage, waterfront play area upgrades, waterfront sea wall repairs etc.

This year, Jan Steele, a long-standing resident of Empire Bay and a member of your Progress Association was recognised at the Central Coast Australia Day awards and at the Terrigal Women of The Year Awards. A wonderful achievement and well deserved. Further details in respect of Jan are contained later in the newsletter.

We are working on upgrading the Progress Association website to improve a few key functions, specifically around automating hall bookings and payments and improved layout. We have discussed requirements with some of our local technology 'savvy' residents and hope to have reached a decision on how to progress in the next couple of months.

At our last meeting, we had a presentation from Brisbane Waters Waterbus (BBW). Since this meeting, a number of presentations and meetings have taken place between BBW and various stakeholders and government officials. Your Progress Association has been invited to sit on the Steering Committee of BBW. If anyone is interested and feel they can add value to this initiative, please let me know. **By Ken Shaw**

LOCAL HISTORY

The Story Behind Warren Yachts - Kincumber

The longtime locals will tell you of the days in the 1990's and the early 2000's when the corner shop would close and school kids would gather along Empire Bay waterfront to see the latest super yacht, from Warren Yacht's Kincumber shipyard, cruise down the channel to it's new home beyond Broken Bay.

Warren Yachts has a history that reflects the passion and innovation of its founder, Dave Warren, and the evolution of the luxury yacht industry in Australia. Dave Warren established his shipyard in a massive building (still standing) behind the Kincumber Mitre 10 in the 1980's.


Dave, born in the UK, spent his childhood in Dorset. At the age of 18 immigrated with his parents to Australia. Here he completed his boat building apprenticeship, building wooden boats at North Harbour Boatshed, Balgowlah, and Cedric William's Boatshed, Bayview.

Dave developed a fascination with speed and design, leading him to build his first ocean racing sailboats. In his Woy Woy boatshed, Dave built 8 boats for Ben Lexcen, and later Alan Bond's yacht for the Admiral Cup.

Dave's keen eve for detail and his relentless pursuit of perfection were evident in every boat he built. He sought to push the boundaries of what was possible in boat design, squeezing every fraction of a knot from hull shapes and engineering solutions. During it's time, Warren Yachts became the largest consumer of carbon fibre in the world.

This dedication to excellence set him apart in the competitive world of luxury boat building.

The 1980s, using his extensive knowledge of marine engineering, Dave began crafting luxury motor yachts that combined speed, elegance, and innovative design.

By the mid-1990s, Warren Yachts had established itself as a world leader in the luxury yacht market. The company gained a reputation not only for the quality of its boats but also for its integrity and passion for boat building. This period saw the introduction of the Warren Super Nova, a groundbreaking model that featured the first retractable hardtop in its category, allowing for a versatile experience on the water. Its design was sleek and modern, contrasting sharply with the more traditional, boxy shapes of competitors. Winning international awards at the Monaco Boat Show. The quality of fit, finish, and material selection was unmatched, reflecting Dave's refusal to compromise on design or engineering.

Dave built 28 boats over 20 years at the Kincumber site. His clients read like the who's who of Australia's rich list and included Greg Norman, Alan Bond, Kerry Packer, Lindsey Fox, Steve Lowy and Rene Rivkin. "All our clients were fairly wealthy" Dave recalls, "so you met some interesting people."

One of the well-known models from Warren Yachts is the Warren S87, a sleek, high-speed motor yacht designed to

compete in the global market. The company also produced several 92-foot and 120-foot flybridge customised vachts, which became popular among buyers seeking a combination of speed, luxury, and comfort.

Dave, reminiscing, "one of the highlights of the Kincumber factory was the construction of \$60 million, 44 m Tri deck motor launch called "**Slipstream**". The paint job alone on the black and silver luxury cruiser cost over \$1,000,000."

The company employed 50 - 120 staff at Kincumber depending on the workload, as well as many subcontractors.

Scott Thorrington, a former employee, attributed the success of Warren Yachts to Dave's attention to detail, his foresight in boat design, and his ability to think creatively beyond traditional moulding techniques and boat building ideas. 'Dave revolutionised luxury boat building in Australia.

In 2003, Warren Yachts was acquired by the American Shipworks Group, and Dave stayed on-board on a part-time basis for a few years. In 2005, with the continued buildup of silt in Kincumber Creek the business became unworkable. and the Kincumber shipyard was forced to relocate to Shipwork's operation in Brisbane.

The downturn in the economy in the 2008 -2009 posed significant challenges and Shipworks closed the Brisbane operation and returned to the USA. Brisbane staff retrenched and moulds sold off.

Dave's legacy lives on through the well-built, high performance Warren Yachts that are still sought after by enthusiasts and collectors today.

Dave Warren is still a local resident, retired, and remains engaged in innovative and challenging high-end projects. You might also catch Dave with the wind in his hair and a smile on his face as he wing-foils at various locations around Brisbane Water. By Robert Thompson

LOCAL AUTHOR

The Secrets of Anzac Ridge: In Flanders Fields

Local author, Patricia Skehan, received an unpublished war diary during lockdown in 2020. She discovered how James (Jim) Armitage, from Sydney Grammar school, enlisted on his eighteenth birthday in May 1917.

Jim and several classmates, assigned to the 3rd Division, 8th Field Artillery Brigade, served under Sir John Monash in Flanders.

The names of Anzac Cove and Anzac Ridge are synonymous with Gallipoli in 1915, but this history is set two years later on the second Anzac Ridge, in Flanders, France.

Jim's diary detailed months of specialist artillery training

before arriving on the infamous battlefields of Flanders: Ypres, Villers-Bretonneux, Amiens. Perrone, Messines, Montbrehain.

Life, in and out of the trenches, is vividly described as the boys matured fast in the battle-hardened arena of war. The setting is the town of Steenwerck, site of the 2nd Australian Casualty Clearing Station near Anzac Ridge. A commandeered chateau in the town served as the secret headquarters for Monash, head of the 5 Australian divisions in Flanders.



For years the township flew under the war radar. Sir John ordered the bombing of Steenwerck once it fell into German control in April 1918. Secrets contained in the chateau and surrounds were too dangerous to fall into enemy hands. Letters from doctors, nurses, padres, and civilians describe the chaos as Steenwerck burned.

Filled with wartime drama, pathos, and humour, additional Anzac stories are sourced from soldiers of several divisions. Field Artillery used horses to haul the heavy wagons moving artillery guns around the battlefields. Many horses were killed in battle.

Jim was 100 years old, the last surviving Central Coast WWI veteran, living in Brentwood Village, Kincumber, in his final days when presented with the Chevalier Medal of Honour by the French Consul-General. Jim quipped, "You're about eighty years too late." By Trish Skehan [Published by Hachette for release in bookstores March 26, prior to Anzac Day, 2025.]


